Acceptable payments include cash, check, Visa, Mastercard, or Discover. Reservations received without appropriate fees will not be processed.

All reservations should be made with the council service center at least two weeks prior to the <u>event.</u> Reservations received less than two weeks prior to requested date may not be approved.

LAKE OF THE OZARKS SCOUT RESERVATION - SHORT TERM CAMPING RESOURCES

CAMPSITES:

There are thirteen campsites at the Lake of the Ozarks Scout Reservation. There are fire pits, shelters and picnic tables in each site and latrines in most sites. There is water in the campsites, shower and laundry facilities nearby for use from April 1st through November 15th. Non Scouting Groups - \$10.00/person/night and deposit \$25.00 per campsite Cost: GRC Scouting Groups – No charge

CANOES AND ROWBOATS:

Canoes and rowboats are available for use on property only. Canoes and rowboats include paddles/oars, and PFD's. All Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat requirements must be met. Non Scouting Groups - \$10.00 each/day

Cost: Scouting Groups - \$5.00 each/day

RIFLE, SHOTGUN AND ARCHERY RANGE:

An archery range and rifle range are available for use by Scouting groups in the off-season. Bows, arrows, 20 gauge shotguns, and .22 caliber rifles may be provided upon request. Targets, ammunition, and cleaning of firearms are the responsibility of the party using the equipment. No equipment may be taken off Scout property. A certified Range Safety Officer AND an NRA instructor or National Camp School Shooting Sports Director is required to use the range.

Cost: Scouting Groups – \$25.00 per day

\$100.00 Deposit required.

OTHER CAMP EQUIPMENT:

Tents with floorboards (\$5.00 each), dining flies (\$5.00 each), cook kits (\$3.00 each), utensil kits (\$2.50 each), griddles (\$2.50 each), and Dutch ovens (\$2.50 each) are available from the camp ranger with prior request. It will be the responsibility of the group to checkout and check-in these items from the Camp Ranger. If items are lost, damaged, or not turned back in, your group will be charged the full replacement cost for these items.

FISCHER LODGE:

This lodge has one large room with fireplace, couches, and chairs. One room is available as a bedroom with four beds. There is a restroom with a shower in this building. The medic's room is available for district and council events with a certified medic on site. Water is available from April 1st – November 1st.

Cost: Scout Groups \$25.00/day (\$50.00/weekend) Non-Scout Groups - \$50.00/day (\$100.00/weekend) Cleaning/damage deposit - \$25.00

STAFF CABINS:

Nine cabins are available for offseason use. Each has concrete floors and two bunk beds. There is no water, heat or air-conditioning in these cabins. Restroom and shower facilities are available nearby, adjacent to the Parkhurst Staff Lodge. **Cost:** Scouting Groups -\$10.00/cabin/night Non Scout Group - \$20.00/cabin/night

PARKHURST STAFF LODGE:

This newly renovated lodge has two spacious sleeping rooms, a kitchen with stoves and refrigerators, and a dining area. Tables and chairs are available. Adjacent to the lodge is a heated restroom & shower facility. The building is heated and has bunks for 16 people upstairs plus an additional 6 downstairs. Also available is a bedroom/bathroom in the basement.

Cost: Scout Groups -\$50.00/day (\$100.00/weekend) Non-Scout Group - \$100.00/day (\$200.00/weekend) Cleaning/damage deposit - \$100.00

CLIMBING AND RAPPELLING TOWER:

Is available for use year around (weather permitting) as long as a Climbing Instructor is present and approved by the Great Rivers Council C.O.P.E./Climbing committee. For a list of the qualified people within the Council, please contact the Council Service Center. Cost: Scouting Groups - \$5.00/person Other Youth Groups: \$10.00/person Adult Groups: \$15.00/person

PROJECT C.O.P.E. (CHALLENGING OUTDOOR PERSONAL EXPERIENCE)

Project C.O.P.E. is an exciting outdoor activity that can be used to attract and hold members in a group. It offers a set of stimulating activities designed to meet the needs of the people who are seeking greater challenges to their physical and mental abilities. Group activities are ideal for emphasizing teamwork and leadership skills. Individual activities promote personal growth. C.O.P.E. starts with initiative games, and continues with low and high course activities. Participants will climb, swing, balance, jump, rappel, and think of solutions to a variety of situations. Cost: \$20.00 per person - Includes registration, COPE bandana, instructors, and the use of safety equipment.

(All participants must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. Food and C.O.P.E. T-shirts are not provided. All participants

in C.O.P.E. must be 13 years old or older by January 1 of the year attending. Each participant must have a current health history and, if under 18, a consent form from a parent or guardian.)

Non-Scouting Groups: \$150 per person, food and lodging included. A Hold Harmless Agreement and certificate of insurance is required.

SAIL MASTER PROGRAM

Troops and Crews may schedule Sailmaster weekends using the sail boats of the Council. Units may receive "Sail on Safely" training for adult leadership during the Hohn Boy Scout Summer Camp session. Safety Afloat, Safe Swim Defense, and Guide to Safe Scouting guidelines are strictly enforced.
